By signing this form the responsible person acknowledges he/she has read and understands the Montana State Library Conference Room Use Policy as approved on December 3, 2008.

The person running the meeting should announce the conference room use guidelines at the beginning of the meeting. That person is expected to see to it that participants adhere to the guidelines so that library patrons and staff are not disturbed.

1. **LOCATION:** The Montana State Library is two blocks east of the State Capitol on Sixth Avenue. The conference room is located to the right at the bottom of the steps inside the Sixth Avenue entrance.
2. **CONFERENCE ROOM DESCRIPTIONS:** See Conference Room Use Guidelines for complete descriptions of each conference room including seating capacity, available furniture and equipment.
3. **BREAKS:** Breaks should be taken in the conference room, in the foyer on the second floor, or outside. Patrons and staff need a quiet place to work; do not take breaks directly outside the conference room or in staff work areas.
4. **MESSAGES:** Montana State Library staff will deliver messages to conference room users only in an emergency. In the event of an emergency persons should call 406.444.3016.
5. **PHOTOCOPY CENTERS:** There are Print & Graphic copy centers located in the DPHHS Building and in the DEQ Building on either side of the Montana State Library.
6. **REFRESHMENTS:** Refreshments may be brought in to the conference rooms. A coffee maker is available in the Grizzly Conference Room but customers must supply their own coffee and filters (see instructions for use on page 10). The Montana State Library does not provide coffee, cups, napkins, etc. There is a cafeteria in the basement of the DPHHS building. **Please keep all refreshments inside the conference room.**
7. **RESTROOMS:** Restrooms are located on the lower level, beyond the public access computer area, on the second floor in the hallway across from the reception desk, and in the main foyer of the Justice Building.

8. **STAFF AVAILABILITY:** Staff are available to answer questions about the facilities and the Montana State Library collections and services. However, please do not ask to use their telephones, photocopy machines, etc.
9. **TELEPHONE USE:** Telephones are available for use in the Bitterroot and Sapphire conference rooms.

Only Montana State Library staff (including Natural Heritage Program staff) and Fish Wildlife and Parks staff located in the Justice Building may make long distance calls from these phones. Staff is required to note the date, time and contact information for person placing calls made on conference room phones.

Others needing to use the phone for long distance calls should have outside parties call in.
