

Ready 2 Read GOES WILD!



Overview

The Montana State Library (MSL) and Montana Fish, Wildlife, and Parks (FWP) have formed a partnership to provide communities throughout Montana with a unique learning opportunity that unites the distinct missions of each agency together.

The Ready 2 Read Goes Wild! trunk provides childcare providers, preschools, early elementary educators, parents and caregivers an opportunity to share language, literacy, learning, and nature with some of Montana's youngest citizens, children from ages three – seven years old.

Part of MSL's statewide early literacy initiative, Ready 2 Read, Ready 2 Read Goes Wild! uses nature and Montana animals to spark kids' interest in language and literacy, math and science, and the natural world that surrounds them.

Each of the Ready 2 Read Goes Wild! trunks focuses on a theme. The themes for the current trunks include owls, ungulates (hooved animals), bears, and animal tracks. Each trunk includes puppets, a number of age-appropriate fiction and non-fiction books on the theme, rubber tracks, and animal parts, including items such as skulls, hides, antlers, feathers, and hooves. Additionally, all of the trunks are supplemented with a *Growing Up Wild: Exploring Nature with Young Children* activity guide.

The activity guide:

- is written especially for early childhood educators of children ages 3-7;
- features 27 field-tested, hands-on, nature-based activities;
- includes crafts, art projects, music, conservation activities, reading and math connections and much more;
- involves social, emotional, physical, language, and cognitive domains to help foster learning and development in all areas;
- supports developmentally appropriate practices allowing children to learn at levels that are individually, socially, and culturally appropriate;
- is correlated to the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) Standards and the Head Start Domains.

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The Montana State Library believes the Ready 2 Read Goes Wild! program will:

- make a wide range of early literacy materials available across the state to all Montanans;
- assist childcare and early education providers by supplying quality early literacy materials, lesson plans, and supplemental materials;
- help parents and caregivers understand the value of sharing language, literacy, and nature with their young children;
- supplement Montana libraries' existing early literacy collections with additional high-quality materials.

Children who participate in the activities that are made available through the Ready 2 Read Goes Wild! trunks will experience hands-on activities that are developmentally appropriate and designed to enhance students':

- Knowledge of and abilities to observe, describe, and discuss the natural world, materials, living things, and natural processes;
- Ability to sort, compare, and classify objects; display data with graphs and pictures; identify shapes; and make measurements;
- Capacity to hear and manipulate sounds, name and recognize letters, and deepen listening and speaking abilities;
- Interest and awareness of numbers and counting as a means for solving problems and determining quantity;
- Creativity to develop art projects as well as solve problems in new and interesting ways;
- Language and literacy skills.

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Borrowing Guidelines

The Ready 2 Read Goes Wild! trunks, which are a project of the Montana State Library and Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks provide high-quality materials focusing on Montana wildlife with the goal of helping to encourage early literacy and language development in the youngest of Montana's library patrons, children ages 3 – 7.

Guidelines

- Anyone with a Montana library card in good standing is eligible to check out the Ready 2 Read Goes Wild! educational trunks.
- Ready 2 Read Goes Wild! trunks are subject to the borrowing guidelines established by the library from which the patron checks the trunk out.
- Ready 2 Read Goes Wild! trunks may be reserved according to the requesting library's reserve policies.
- Ready 2 Read Goes Wild! trunks may be renewed according to the renewal guidelines established by the library from which the patron checks the trunk out.
- Borrowers should inventory their trunk when they receive it and again before they return it. An inventory sheet is provided in all trunks for this purpose.
- Borrowers are not liable for wear and tear on the trunk contents as a result of normal use. Borrowers are responsible for the care and security of the trunk while it is in their possession. Any damage that occurs due to abuse of the trunks or its contents is the responsibility of the borrower.
- Borrowers are responsible for paying the replacement costs plus a 15% overhead fee to cover shipping, handling and processing of all damaged or lost contents of the Ready 2 Read Goes Wild! trunks.
